RESEARCH GRANTS

Deadline: August 1, 2020**

The Research Society for American Periodicals (RSAP) invites applications for grants of between **\$250 and \$1,000** to enhance research activities in American periodicals. These grants are intended for early career scholars – graduate students and those who have received their doctorate within the last five years – and are open to those who are “researching in place” in the midst of the ongoing pandemic. The funds may be used in a variety of ways, including but not limited to: a subscription to an online database or resource; reproduction or copyright/use fees for brick-and-mortar archival materials or digital database materials; travel to archives; childcare to enable travel or a concentrated period of research/writing; computer software.

Evaluation Criteria:

1. Potential to contribute to the applicant’s professional growth
2. Potential to contribute to American periodicals research
3. Feasibility of the project
4. Clarity and soundness of the budget, objectives, methods, and scope of the proposal

Application—Please submit electronically a single pdf document that includes the following:

1. Cover sheet (attached)
2. Description of Project (not to exceed 1000 words)
3. Budget
4. Brief CV (not to exceed 2 pages)

List the major costs of your proposed project and how you intend to use the requested funds. Please indicate what other financial support you have already received for this project and any additional financial support that you anticipate receiving for this project.
